STARS Summary Report



STARS is Vermont's Quality Recognition System for Early Childhood Care and Education and is an intiative of the Child Development Division. All Registered Family Child Care Homes, School Operated Pre-Kindergarten Programs, Licensed Early Childhood Centers, and After School Programs are eligible to participate in STARS and be recognized for the quality services they provide to Vermonters. Programs that participate in STARS are stepping ahead-going above and beyond state regulations to provide professional services that meet the needs of children and families. As the value of this voluntary system has come to be recognized by consumers and providers, participation continues to grow.

At its inception, the creators of STARS envisioned a program STARS as:

- An agent to improve quality, involving the maximum number of programs.
- A program growth plan, providing clear paths for next achievements.
- A consumer tool for education and choice.
- An agent that makes a different for the maximum number of children.




STARS by the Number:


Participation since 2003

Public and Provider Engagement

Since the inception of STARS engaging the provider community has been a focus. From the original 42 public forums in 2001 and 2002, through the development of the STARS Oversight Committee, the voice of the provider community has been encouraged. In October 2005 the STARS Website was created for use by providers and parents. In March 2007 a STARS participant satisfaction survey was conducted. Following the change of administration in 2010 a second STARS participant survey was conducted in January 2011.
